Dear Parishioners,

This past week we had our Summer Vacation Bible School, *Passport to Peru*. There were a total of 100 campers in both the morning and afternoon program with 40 facilitators, including many high school students completing community service. Each day one memorable Bible point was reinforced through games, songs, imagination station and Bible theater. The five Bible points were that God gives us comfort, patience, peace, love and joy. I wish to thank Sharon Keith who has directed our Bible camps and all her helpers. I remind parents that the Bible camp continues now each day in their homes with daily family prayer and Scripture.

We have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Monday - Friday beginning after the 9 a.m. Mass up until midnight except on Wednesday when Adoration comes to an end at 6:30 p.m. and on Friday ending at 10:30 p.m. The bulletin lists the times that we are in need of coverage for our Eucharistic Adoration on page 5. There is a gradual turnover due to sickness, death, or other reasons. We need to have at least two people committed to one half hour. If you are able to fill one of the vacant time slots, please call the rectory so you may be put on the schedule. Again, this is showing hospitality to the presence of the Eucharistic Lord who is in our community, dwelling among us in our tabernacles. It is our desire that each family be represented once a week in Adoration before the Lord. I thank all who are faithfully committed to Eucharistic Adoration. It is a blessing to our parish community.

We will begin a new DVD series on Tuesday, August 8, at 7:00 p.m. It is a series on *The Catholic Faith Explained*. We might be familiar with different aspects of the Catholic faith. But how does it all fit together? This series opens up the "big picture" of the Catholic faith in a way that helps us know it, live it, and articulate it to others. In it, Edward Sri leads a team of teachers. You can also see the series online through our parish subscription to *Formed.org*.

Too Good Not to Share

During court proceedings, witnesses are more than onlookers or spectators. They are active participants who help determine the outcome of a case. The same is true of our witness for Christ. We are to be active participants in a matter of absolute importance—the truth of Jesus's death and resurrection.

When John the Baptist came to tell people about Jesus, the light of the world, he did so by declaring his knowledge of Jesus. And John the disciple, who recorded the events, testified of his experience with Jesus: "We have seen His glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14). The apostle Paul would elaborate on this idea as he told young Timothy, "The things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others" (2 Tim. 2:2).

All Christians have been summoned before the courtroom of the world. The Bible says we are not mere spectators but active participants. We testify to the truth about Jesus's death and resurrection. John the Baptist was the voice of one calling in the desert. Our voices can be heard in our workplace, neighborhood, church, and among our family and friends. As you know, our Religious Education program schedules meetings with both children and parents throughout the year. Through their discussion, parents have shared ideas that have carried them through their talks with their children on spiritual matters.

The following are some of the suggestions parents from Grade 1 and 2 offered for "keeping the faith" especially during the summer months. This column will run periodically with a variety of themes...

• When travelling some families pointed out that they tried to visit at least one new church pointing out the similarities between that one and their home parish of St. Joseph. This opened discussion on the importance of continuing to attend Mass during their vacation and why it was especially important to recognize that Jesus should, and can be, included in our vacation plans.

• Along the lines of connecting children to the wonders of creation, one can point out the beauty of whatever area one is in at home or on vacation and having a quick discussion on God's powers and goodness in light of his creation.

• One way to keep God centered while on vacation is to open the day with a prayer thanking God for the new day, and then again thanking God for the events of another beautiful day. Of course other prayers can be utilized during the day. One way to deepen this practice is to incorporate the condensed form of Ignatian Spirituality -- (St. Ignatius found God everywhere - in work, play, nature, etc.)
