REQUIRED READING

The Bible (I use the New American Bible, but any Catholic Bible will do).

CLASS REQUIREMENTS

- Actively listen and participate in weekly religious education classes.
- Attend <u>two</u> early class start times (10/30, 12/18, 2/26, or 4/9 meet in the church for adoration beginning at 7:00pm).
- Attend *two* Youth Group meetings or events:
 - Meetings take place every Sunday before class at 6:30pm (except 10/30, 12/18, 2/26, and 4/9).
 - Youth Group events (field trips, concerts, community service, etc.) will be announced to the class as well on the Youth Group bulletin board, the St. Joseph Youth Ministry Facebook/Twitter page, and in the weekly bulletin.
 - Of course, students are invited and encouraged to attend more than two meetings or events.
- Participate in an evening retreat with guests from New Spirit Inc. on Wednesday, April 5th from 5:00 to 9:00 PM.

ATTENDENCE POLICY

Class attendance and participation are required.

A short homework assignment may be assigned if absence occurs.

More than three unexcused absences will need to be discussed with Fr. Ron to see if student can continue with class.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR POLICY

Students must act with respect and show Christian love to all of their fellow classmates. If a student personally attacks or demeans another for *any* reason, he or she will be asked to leave for the day. Their parent/s or guardian/s will be notified to pick up the student. This will count towards an unexcused absence.

DRESS CODE POLICY

Students will dress modestly not only for themselves, but for students around them.

- Shorts/skirts/dresses must not be shorter than fingertip length when the student's arm is placed at his or her side.
- No tube tops, muscle shirts, midriff styles, or revealing necklines.
- Clothing will not be excessively tight and must fit properly.
- Inappropriate wording will not be tolerated.

CELL PHONE POLICY

Cell phones cannot be used in class unless for an emergency or family contact is needed. If a student is using their phone during class and not actively participating, he or she will be asked to give up their phone until the end of class.
